WHEN it came to administering some first aid to the Dora Phillips Hall in Eastwood, councillors Ellie Lodziak and David Taylor were quick to dish up a dose of cash from their respective EDI pots. And being the good sports they are, they volunteered to sample some of the bandaging skills being practised by members of the St John Ambulance nursing cadets who meet there. The hall - also known as the Eastwood Girls' Centre - plays host to hundreds of women and girls from the local area every week, as the base for scores of activities including Rainbows, Brownies, Guides, yoga classes, an art group and keep fit. The EDI cheque for £1,500 will pay for new chairs for the centre, which was first set up in 1962 as a place where women and young girls of the town could meet.
